



### From the Desk of Dan Smith, Priest-in-Charge

Dear Friends,

As we move to October and November the calendar is full and there is great emotion, grief with Greg McDaniel's funeral on the 8<sup>th</sup> and unbelievable joy with Rob's ordination as a priest on November 19. In between and after there are clean-up days, worship, thanksgiving, finalization of plans for next year, candidates for Bishop, and Bishop candidates walk abouts (a chance to meet and listen to the candidates). We will also be welcoming home those of our congregation who spend time each year in other parts of the country. All in all, there is a lot going on.

I do want to say a few words around the ordination. I remember my ordination like it was yester-day instead of almost 41 years ago. There is not the time or space for the theological conversation of what takes place at ordination. Suffice it to say that my life was changed. That is going to happen with Rob. His life takes off in a new trajectory. We, and I really mean we, are setting him not apart from the rest of us, but in a role that is important and special to the rest of us. We are ordaining him to a ministry of word and sacrament. Rob has certainly already found his preaching voice, though that too will change and grow. He will begin to share the sacraments in a new and deeper way. He will be given authority to preside at the altar, to announce God's forgiveness and God's blessing. I can tell you that all three of those are humbling experiences, all three among the great honors of my life.

If you have never been to an ordination, it is a powerful experience for all who are present. The lessons for the day are a calling to leadership, the litany for ordination is soul touching as the prayers for the candidate are offered and the candidate realizes that they must humble themselves before God and the rest of us. The ordination itself, when the priests present join the Bishop in the laying on of hands and frankly to the candidate it feels like the weight of the world is pressing down on you. The joy of the music and the fellowship afterwards are icing on the cake. I do hope Nov. 19 is already on you calendar and that you will be present. Rob needs you there.

I want to also say a word about the 20<sup>th</sup>. That Sunday morning Rob will preside for the first time at the Eucharist. For a priest this is almost, perhaps within a breath of being as important as the ordination itself. That is because the center of the priest's ministry is the table and the sacrament of the altar. So, even though you will have been here on the 19<sup>th</sup>, it is extremely important for you to be here the next day as well. I was more nervous behind the altar then I was at the ordination. Be there for Rob in your prayers as well as with your presence.

Please also remember that we will have a lot of guests with us in the next several months. Let's welcome them with all the love we have for one another and for Holy Cross. Remember to invite your friends and family to join us.

### **Holy Cross 150th Anniversary Celebration**



In the last issue of *The Crossroads,* we told of our first church building being destroyed by a storm in 1880.

Continuing with the story: A new location (the old church location was used for the new rectory) was bought on the corner on Park Avenue and Fourth Street and a modified Upjohn church was constructed using materials where possible from the ruins of the first church. Again Mrs. Sanford sought contributions from her friends to rebuild the church. The building was completed in 1882 with a high spire which became a landmark along the St. John's River.

By November of 1891, Holy Cross was again out of debt and the second church was consecrated by the Bishop of Florida, E.G. Weed, November 1<sup>st</sup>, 1891, All Saints Day.

### 1891

In 1883 the Rev. S. B. Carpenter became rector. In the diocesan records, Holy Cross was reported having 42 families.

Bishop Young had died in 1885 and the Reverend Edwin Gardner Weed was nominated and confirmed as Bishop. By 1888, the diocese had grown from seven churches in 1838 to 80 parishes and organized missions with 54 ministers. The General Convention of the Episcopal Church in 1892 divided the diocese with the Right Reverend William Crane Gray as Bishop of the Missionary Jurisdiction of South Florida. This new diocese included all the counties in Florida south of the counties of Leon, Alachua, Putman and St. John's. Holy Cross was one of the parishes transferred to the new diocese. In February, 1893, Holy Cross Church in Sanford hosted the organizational convention of the new diocese. She became known as the "Mother Church."

In 1892 Henry and Gertrude Sanford's daughter was married in the church with many of New York's most celebrated society coming to attend the festivities by special train. After the ceremony, the guests went to Belair (Sanford's experimental horticultural station and lodge), where songs were sung by the Holy Cross choir and the marriage was celebrated. Her husband, Stephen Sanford (yes, he also had the surname of Sanford) had given the carpet for the first church, and at the time of the marriage donated another carpet for the second church.

Back-to-back freezes in 1894 and 1895 devastated Sanford and the surrounding area. Those parishioners who did not move were left without means of livelihood. There was no way to pay a regular priest; therefore, visiting clergy from the north and local clergy supplied the parish. It was 1913 before Holy Cross had a regular priest, the Reverend Arthur Searing Peck.

The Rev. Peck's tenure was a period of growth and great activity. The first Parish House was dedicated and became something of a community center as it was used by city, religious, fraternal,

patriotic and social organizations. There was a library, billiard table, bowling alley, a moving picture machine, and Holy Cross even had a basketball team.

Alas, tragedy struck once again. On November 27, 1923, a fire raced through the church, Parish House, and Rectory. The city fire hydrants could not supply enough pressure to aid the fire department in putting out the fire. The church records were under lock and key so they also burned.

Again, the congregation began plans to rebuild. Fr. Peck, though providing a major influence in the building of a new church, resigned in 1924. It was felt that the strain of the disaster had proven too great.


